Message from OHS Manager



28 TRAINED IN FIRST AID AND AED PROCEDURES

As employees, parents, sons and daughters, we must all have an understanding of how to assist those around us in times of emergencies.

Sometimes the difference between life and death, is the assistance you can offer until emergency personnel arrive.

This training will occur twice a month until most staff are trained.

SUPERB EMERGENCY EVACUATION DRILL

An emergency drill was executed in Virgin Gorda to test the staff's ability to exit the building safety while still ensuring the safety of customers.

The Virgin Gorda team surpassed the evacuation time as they ran swiftly to the old building site in under 2 minutes.

All facilities will undergo emergency drills twice per year.





WATER TANK FIXED AND CLEANED

YOUR MONTHLY QUICK TIPS



When lifting, always use your legs and not your back. Using the back to lift can cause long term injuries and ill-health.



Bleach and regular household cleaners will not kill mould. It will discolour, but will not kill. Mould can only be eradicated with fungicide.

There are **four** essential steps to take if you discover a fire:

In case of fire, always remember these steps. Help to RESCUE those around you by assisting with evacuation. Raise the ALARM on your way out. Always close doors and cubicles as you leave to CONTAIN the fire. If you are trained, try to EXTINGUISH the fire.
